1 John 1:7 says that if we walk in the light we have fellowship with God and the blood of his son cleanses us of all sin. He then goes on to say that we will sin and when we do we must confess our sins and they will be forgiven. This is a comforting passage because I know that I sin often. Then we read in 1 John 3:4-10 that the one who is in Christ cannot sin because in God there is no darkness at all. This is a little more challenging. Some think it to be a contradiction.

But listen to it again. If we are walking in the light we are in fellowship with God. In the light is no darkness (i.e. no sin). Therefore if you are walking in the light in which there is no darkness then you do not have darkness in you. But you will eventually step out of the light. This does not mean that you are completely dark, only that you need to confess you sins and they will be forgiven. The passage in chapter 3 is referring to a lifestyle of continually sinning and practicing unrighteousness. If we decide to willfully and deliberately walk away from the light then we are not in the light and we are no longer in fellowship with Him. But if we have made the decision to walk in that light and are trying to keep on the straight path, we can be forgiven those little slips because they do not define our lives.

This is a very encouraging passage with challenges. John comforts us in the knowledge that forgiveness is available while warning us that we do not have free reign to sin at will and confess at random. We must first set our feet on the path of righteousness. Then we must take each step in the direction of light. If we make that effort then a misstep will be covered by the blood of Christ. It is your decision. Set your feet on the way that leads to life.
